A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Helping people to live great lives and making an impact throughout Brant is what drives Brantwood's work each and every day. We are able to do this through the professional work of Brantwood employees and the generosity of volunteers who give of their time and wisdom to make this community and our organization a better place.

Brantwood Community Services recently completed its first fiscal year since launching the new strategic plan and we are pleased to announce that the new plan shows the organization is on track to achieve its goals by 2021.

During 2016/17 Brantwood:

- Provided supports to over 627 individuals and their families
- Developed an Innovative Shared-Care space at Paris Road providing supports to 2 new individuals
- Supported the Ministry of Community and Social Services (MCSS) Multi-Year Residential Planning by developing a space for a young man transitioning to adult services
- Hosted family information sessions on the Registered Disability Savings Program (RDSP) and Henson Trusts
- Connected with 45 youth transitioning from school to adult developmental services
- Achieved 100% compliance with regulations related to Quality Assurance Measures
- Increased **fee-for-service** supports by 33%
- Further developed our expertise in delivering palliative supports (end of life care)
- Provided "If You Lead They Will Follow" training to Brantwood's leadership team

- Participated in the Ministry's Personal Outcomes
 Pilot Study to ensure the interests and voice of people receiving complex supports were heard
- Improved recruitment, selection and onboarding of new employees; stabilizing our workforce
- Successfully negotiated a new 3 year collective agreement in partnership with SEIU
- Launched a new website (www.brantwood.ca)
- Provided administration, program space, housing, housekeeping, and maintenance services to Operation Lift, Lansdowne Children's Centre, Community Living Brant, Participation House, Bethesda (Twin Lakes) and the Boys and Girls Club of Brantford

These accomplishments highlight the tremendous effort and dedication of our staff and volunteers to ensure opportunities and success are found for those who seek our supports and services. Brantwood offers our sincerest thanks to out-going board member Nora Fueten. SUPPORT SERVICES

Brantwood's residential supports include group living, specialized intensive supports, shared-care, overnight respite and supported independent living to those with a developmental disability who may also present with physical, health and other complex challenges.

A person centred thinking approach builds capacity to ensure person centred practice and this ultimately results in opportunities for people to achieve their dreams and build networks of support.

In support of Brantwood's Strategic plan, and the Ministry's Multi-Year Residential Planning, we expanded our Specialized Residential program and welcomed Matthew to Brantwood.

Gaining the required expertise to deliver behavioural supports has strengthened Brantwood's capacity to deliver much needed services. Through our specialized residential homes and with the help of behaviour consultants and direct support professionals, persons with developmental disabilities are living inclusive lives and experiencing full citizenship in their community.

Brantwood increased Weekend Respite services offered at the Inn on Strawberry Hill and opened up a new Innovative Shared-Care apartment at Paris Road. This apartment offers respite for two families and provides two people with a transitional living environment that develops and fosters independence skills.



In addition, Brantwood has been incredibly responsive to community emergency needs for those requiring overnight or day respite. Many of Brantwood's teams have been flexible and creative in providing temporary solutions to those families in crisis.

Opportunities for people to experience full citizenship remains one of our priorities. Many examples of this were seen throughout the year and we continue to work on enhancing this for everyone we support. Meaningful new opportunities have been experienced by many including new friendships, stronger ties with family, participation in local government and community events, dream vacations, employment and giving back to their community through volunteering and fundraising.

Health supports remain strong at Brantwood. In the past year there have been minimal hospitalizations and when needed, palliative care support was provided. Our pharmacy provider worked with us to ensure safe medication practices. Brantwood's Direct Support Professionals and the Nursing team continue to strive and advocate for the best services for the people supported by Brantwood.

RECREATION THERAPY CENTRE: DELIVERING SERVICES OUR COMMUNITY NEEDS

Continued learning is a goal supported by Brantwood's Foundation for Success (Community Day Supports) program that now delivers over 50 **life skill** and **community** classes.

Community access to Brantwood's Recreation Therapy Centre increased by 56% this year. Neighbours, seniors, cultural groups and other people in the community enjoyed pool memberships, water fitness classes, drumming, multi-sensory, evening recreation and general interest programs.

Fee-for-Service and Passport Funding Programs grew by 33% over the previous year, with the majority of people purchasing day services (Foundations for Success) and overnight respite.

WORK-ABILITIES

Sixteen people graduated from Brantwood's Work-Abilities preemployment program in 2016, enhancing their skills to become employment ready. Graduates have gone on to find regular employment, trial placements or volunteer positions in the community.

Work-Abilities underwent a transformation over the past year, with a greater focus on

identifying practical occupational skills, developing the competencies through hands on practice and community based work trials. The program included both internal and external placement opportunities as well as business planning workshops for those participants interested in developing their own micro business.

SECOND ANNUAL DISABILITY MENTORING DAY (DMD)

In partnership with Dolphin Digital Technologies, Brantwood hosted Brantford's Second Annual Disabilities Mentoring Day (DMD) on October 26, 2016. DMD facilitated the pairing of persons with disabilities with companies that utilize the skills they have or are developing through training. Eight people gained insight from employers about job requirements, job duties and where the mentee skills sets are a best fit. The mentees demonstrated to local employers that it is their ability that counts, not their disability. DMD employers included The City of Brantford, Brantford Cyclepath, The Hampton Inn, ShopBrantford, Toppers Pizza, Brantford Symphony Orchestra and PCT Computers.

The overnight guests were able to enjoy Brantwood's Recreation Therapy Centre in the evening where they could wind down after a busy day by enjoying a relaxing swim in the warm water pool, going for ice cream or spending some quiet time in the multi-sensory room.


FINANCIALS 2016/17


Brantwood along with its provincial counterparts in Developmental Services, experienced significant financial pressures during the 2016/17 fiscal year.

Rising operational costs, including food and utilities and ever increasing administrative pressures related to the Ministry of Community and Social Services (MCSS) Transformation Agenda is now at a critical point with resources maximized to meet current service delivery levels. With no new base budget funding from MCSS in over eight years, Brantwood continues to operate in an ever challenging financial environment and continues to advocate for provincial funding changes through its membership with OASIS and the Provincial Network.

Despite these significant challenges we have continued to provide the highest quality of services. Our goal remains to maximize the funds spent on services while minimizing administrative costs. Ongoing support from our funders, donors and the dedication of our volunteers and employees make it possible for Brantwood to deliver supports. We thank our funders and donors for their continued confidence in Brantwood Community Services.

THANK YOU TO OUR COMMUNITY

HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2016 - 2017

- On May 25, 2016, one-hundredand-thirty-one golfers came out to Northridge to participate in the 21st Annual Charity Golf Tournament. Over 30 volunteers and 40 corporate and community sponsors supported the event which raised a total of \$30,000. Thank you to the 80 local businesses and individuals who donated silent and live auction items and to Strodes BBQ & Deli for generously donating the lunch for the event. Funds raised at the event will go towards the purchase of a wheelchair accessible vehicle for Brantwood.
- On January 26, 2017, Brantwood and Participation House Brantford hosted the 27th Annual wheelchair Basketball Tournament at the Branlyn Community Centre with the support of the North Brantford Lions Club. Sixteen teams competed, raising over \$6,000 to support Brantwood and Participation House. Thank you to all of the volunteers who helped at the event including all of the referees from the Brant Norfolk Basketball Association, and to the Investors Group for their sponsorship of the Stationary Chair Challenge.
- Brantwood was successful in raising over \$33,000 in grants and individual donations to support the purchase of a HubScrub. This automated wheelchair cleaning service cleans and disinfects wheelchairs and other mobility devices, saving on labour and helping to reduce infections. The unit was purchased in early 2017 and the initial focus has been on the people supported by Brantwood as





the first users of the service. A start-up marketing and business plan is being developed and once the plan is complete Brantwood will be reaching out to the community to further expand the business. Brantwood will also be hiring a person with a disability to assist with the operation of the HubScrub service. Thank you to all of the funders and individual donors who supported this project.

 Brantwood was very pleased to be the recipient of funds raised through the 1st Annual Brant Improv Festival, which took place on January 26-27, 2017. Attendees enjoyed samples of improv comedy, improv painting, improv music, and improv fashion over two nights. Thank you to organizers Martin Smith, Kevin Procter, Steven B. Andrews and Kis Productions for all of the work that went into planning the event and for so generously donating the funds raised to Brantwood.
