

We continued to reimagine services that reflect community, inclusion, and choice with the Community Connections program delivering over 4400 hours of individualized supports and bringing Kinesiology supports directly to people in their homes and neighbourhoods. These are a sample of the successes you will see throughout the 2021-2022 Annual Report finishing the year with the reopening of the INN on Strawberry Hill, welcoming guests and providing the opportunity for people we serve and their families to take a break.

## **Human Resources**



The partnership across Brantwood can be seen in the success of the Joint Health and Safety Committee (JHSC). Over the year, the JHSC met 28 hours, made critical recommendations and decisions related to vaccination, rapid testing, PPE and policies including a new protocol planning for low, medium and high staffing challenges throughout Omicron and an Early and Safe Return to Work Protocol.





Brantwood is proud to be a Chair of the MCCSS Operational Leaders Subcommittee and support the Ministry's Workforce Initiatives including the Modernized Core Competencies and the Marketing and Recruitment materials to address the challenges to attract professionals to meaningful positions in Developmental Services.

Brantwood Community Services was the inaugral winner of the Chamber of Commerce Brantford-Brant award for Diversity and Inclusion sponsored by OLG.





# Residential Supports & Services



2021-2022 over 200 team members served 74 unique individuals across 14 settings. We continued to reimagine housing and technology with a renovation of a larger home resulting in 3 individual spaces and a 4 person home. This supports our commitment to individualized living and supports, and continues to move away from congregate living. Training and supports were provided across the organization highlighting person directed planning and outcomes. As Journey to Belonging continues to evolve, Brantwood continues to put the person, their dreams, goals and supports at the center of all we do.


Respite Services

In 2021-22, the Abilities Centre continued to partner with Funders and local organizations to expand the Abilities Centre Hub and to align day, leisure, and respite supports with MCCSS' Journey to Belonging.

The continued support from the Foundation for Human Development providing critical funding to ensure additional mileage, PPE and additional staffing hours for cleaning were not passed on to people served and their families.

As the pandemic continued to challenge reopening plans, the need for families supporting their loved one at home to have a break grew. In March 2022, Brantwood responded with the successful reopening of the respite location Inn on Strawberry Hill supporting 11 people with 29 nights of overnight respite in this first month.

Community Connections continued to grow providing leisure and community based passport supports to people in their neighbourhood and throughout their community. This new model of leisure and community based services builds capacity for the person, supports social inclusion and continues to reflect person directed outcomes.


3 billboards used to market Brantwood and targeted recruitment and Facebook ads resulting in 400 unique interactions.


New partnerships with Mohawk College, Westervelt College and Fanshawe College to support PSW student placements and to explore careers in Developmental Services.

## **Financials 2021 - 2022**





The Fiscal Year 2021-2022 was another successful year for Brantwood Community Services. Continued financial support from the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services enabled Brantwood to provie exemplary on-going support to people and their families.

The Temporary Wage Enhancement was an important investment by MCCSS throughout the Fiscal Year with an announcement of the investment becoming a Permanent Compensation Enhancement in 2022-2023.


Throughout 2021-2022, Brantwood managed expenditures and continued investments in pandemic response measures including HEPA filters and PPE.


## Clinical Services

Brantwood's Seating Clinic assists people by assessing and building custom wheelchairs and mobility devices.

In 2021/22, the Seating Clinic supported over 287 custom seating orders and wheelchair repairs and over 175 Hub Scrubs.


In May of 2021, a revamp of the supports offered by the Kinesiologist moved from the Abilities Centre to where people lived. 33 plans were developed and people were supported to ride bikes, take walks and complete Range of Motion exercises to improve their health.





Brantwood's MCCSS IPAC
(Infection Prevention & Control)
Champion supported 25+
congregate care providers in
partnership with the Brant
County Health Unit. Completed
10 onsite IPAC assessments,
over 2200 rapid tests across 11
organizations, and supported 4
organizations by providing
onsite N95 Fit-Testing.

Brantwood's RPN team supported 74 people with complex medical conditions and developmental disabilities. Brantwood's dedicated team of RPN professionals received the Nurses Retention Incentive, and provided medication and Controlled Acts training to over 175 team members.



"Since I was 5, I have been in the same standard seat that was store bought. It has served me well for over three decades, however as I've grown, it became clear that a specialized seating system was required. I was introduced to Richard, Drew, and Adrianna. Over several appointments, we worked together to design a seating system that would work for me. The first meeting we discussed and assessed my physical needs, and my lifestyle. Drew, Richard and Adrianna, Brantwood's Seating Clinic team, were exceptionally professional, friendly, knowledgeable and skilled. 
