Brantwood Community Services continues its journey in realizing our Vision of a community benefitting from diversity in culture, life experience and abilities. Our annual report is a reflection of the work we have done together alongside team members, leaders, volunteers, family, friends and funders. We value these collaborations and relationships and share this report as a celebration of our achievements to date and the opportunities ahead.

As we explore technology to improve service delivery and efficiencies, the launch of Sihata in 2024 allows for people to schedule their lives and supports based on their staffing preferences, goals, and interests. As an organization we continue to identify efficiencies that improve the experience for people we serve and for the team members providing the supports.

The development of a skilled workforce continued in 2024 2025 through training and development in Person Directed Choice, communication and conflict resolution, operational leadership, and advancing equity and inclusion. Brantwood collaborates with local and Provincial groups including the Grand Erie Workforce Planning Board, Local Planning Tables, Developmental Services Workforce Initiative, and the Provincial Network HR Committee to ensure Brantwood is well positioned for the changes ahead.

Conversations That Matter relaunched to connect team members from across the agency, to learn, listen and grow from one another. Shout outs and supervisions continue to reflect a culture of connectedness and peer recognition. The great work we do is because of the great people that make up Brantwood's team.



As we continue through our strategic plan, the most noticeable success is the expansion of Community Connections. This community based model in place of day supports continues to grow with over \$1 million invested in connecting people to their community. This success is about choice and inclusion for people and reflects our vision of a community that benefits from all abilities.

We also pause to recognize and appreciate the impact that Brantwood's services have on others. A long time supporter and father, gifted \$500,000 of his estate to the Brantwood Foundation as a testament to his gratitude and support for the services delivered by Brantwood to his family members.

Brantwood provides supports and services in a variety of models that ensure people with complex medical, behavioural and developmental disabilities have tailored supports to meet their needs.

In 2024 2025 Brantwood planned for 2 sisters who lived with an aging family member. The concern was that there would be no place for them should their family member be unable to support them. Although their supports were different, both sisters wanted to stay together.

Brantwood responded with an opportunity for both sisters to live beside each other, while having their own individual supports and space. Today, they maintain their relationship alongside a new relationship with their family member and friends.

18 Housing Options 15 Locations

Brantwood continues to deliver on full lives and individual choices while supporting people who have been misplaced in hospital. In 2024 2025, Brantwood supported 2 people to transition out of hospital and into their home. These are important ways that Brantwood supports Brantford-Brant, our community resources, and delivers on our Mission, Vision and Values.

Opportunity Turns to Friendship

A significant barrier faced by people with developmental disabilities is isolation. Recognizing that many people lack unpaid, relationships and friendships, Community Connections identified 4 people who had similar interests, but had not yet had the opportunity to meet each other.

Supported by a Brantwood Team Member, a journey of introducing these 4 people began with a focus on:

- Learning social skills a new skill when people have only spent time with family and/or paid staff
- Appropriate relationships how to have a conversation and understand how to respond
- Confidence building each person's confidence so that they feel valued and can see the value in others
- Give and Take when someone had a new idea and others were not sure they wanted to try it, together they took risks and found things they liked to do.

Along the way, they also grew to appreciate each other and a friendship grew. Today, 4 strangers have become 4 friends doing what they want to do, when they want to do it



In addition to training, RPNs actively support individuals by attending medical appointments, assisting during hospital visits, and preparing for annual physicals. The team also maintains a strong collaborative relationship with Sensity, providing approximately six hours of monthly clinical support focused on medication training, injections, G-tube care, and other controlled acts



Clinical Services remain a cornerstone of Brantwood's legacy. Brantwood is proud to offer clinical services and holds a valued seat on the Specialized Clinical Developmental Services Network (SCDSN) Board of Directors. Brantwood team members contributed to the development of the Network's Strategic Plan, played a leadership role on the conference planning committee, and helped initiate and design the SCDSN website. Brantwood continues to be an active participant in the network, working alongside fellow members to advocate for a robust and coordinated system of specialized clinical supports.



Inn on Strawberry Hill

The Inn on Strawberry Hill provides overnight respite to people and their families living in Brantford -Brant.

19,200+ Hours of Support

The Inn continues to welcome guests for stays that allows a temporary break for holidays, family members recovering from surgery, to hang out with friends, and to support transitions. Stays are scheduled across the year for up to 2 weeks in length.

Not your average hotel, guests enjoy barbeques, cooking meals, learning skills towards independence and have the opportunity to book stays with friends.

Prioritizing Brantford-Brant

As Brantford-Brant continues to grow, so has the need for emergency and temporary respite supports. Brantwood continues to prioritize temporary fee for service respite for those living in Brantford-Brant.

Financials 2024 - 2025

The fiscal year 2024-2025 proved to be another successful year for Brantwood Community Services. Continued support from the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services (MCCSS) allowed us to provide exceptional, ongoing assistance to the people we serve and their families.

Throughout 2024-2025, Brantwood effectively managed its expenditures while making strategic investments including sensory spaces, training and development, and appliance replacements. Project funding from the Canada-Ontario Community Housing Initiative, provided for fencing and gate replacement to enhance security, and funding for a shower renovation to increase accessibility.




