# Brantwood Receives Major Funding to Improve Accessibility

On April 18, 2017 The Honourable Dr. Helena Jaczek, Ontario's Minister of Community and Social Services, was at Brantwood to announce \$192,000 in funding from the Social Housing Improvement Program for facility upgrades to improve accessibility for the people that we support.

The funding will provide new flooring at two of Brantwood's group homes as well as 23 X-Y ceiling lifts at four group homes. The lifts and flooring will improve accessibility by providing individuals who use wheelchairs safe access to all areas of their homes.

After a tour of the facility the Minister said that she learned a few new things through her visit and commented on how unique Brantwood was in terms of the variety of services and activities offered.

"I see so many services coming together," she said afterward. It's a real model for others to follow."

With respect to government programs she said "There is no one size fits all. It's all very individualized needs especially in those with developmental challenges. As we transform, for the better, away from institutions towards more group home situations, from shelter to employment, we need to be mindful of people."

The funding for Brantwood was part of a larger announcement by the governments of Canada and Ontario of more than \$4.1 million in funding to more than 160 projects in 46 community agencies across Ontario. The funding is to improve and maintain the quality of dedicated supportive housing for individuals who require support services to continue living independently in the community.

## A Tradition of Giving Back

People supported by Brantwood are active in the community and give back in many ways. Over the past year, people supported by Brantwood have volunteered at John Noble Home, Agnes Hodge Public School, the Closet Door, the YMCA children's drop in program, the Chamber of Commerce, the Brantford Christian School, the Salvation Army Food Bank, Amani Acres, Friendship House, and K9 Case Dog Training.

Continuing in this tradition of giving back, people supported by Brantwood have been actively fundraising for charities and causes that are close to their hearts. Alyssa has organized a series of paint parties to spread her love of art and raise funds for Brantwood's United Way Campaign. So far she has raised \$188.00. Rick organized a cupcake day and raised \$254 for his favorite cause, the Brant County SPCA. Finally, Cody trained very hard for the Rotary Classic 5K run on April 30 which he completed in a great time of 33 minutes.

## **Work-Abilities**

**Work-Abilities** is a pre-employment and skills-development program that assists people with developmental disabilities prepare for employment. The program aims to: increase the number of people with developmental challenges obtaining competitive employment; reduce social isolation; and assist in creating workplaces that are inclusive and diverse.



Work-Abilities continues to adjust to meet the individual needs of participants. There is a new focus around identifying practical occupational skills, developing competencies through hands on practice and then community based work trials.

Over the past few months, Work-Abilities has developed a new partnership with the W. Ross McDonald School. The students in the graduating class have been learning the curriculum and practicing occupational skills in classes. They are now moving into the placement phase of the program and some of them are beginning their work trials at various locations within the community. Two of the students who have an interest in fitness, health and nutrition will be doing their work trial at Natural Path Fitness. A student with strong swimming skills and a love of the pool with be providing program assistance at the Hydrotherapy Pool in Brantwood's Recreational Therapy Centre.

Past Work-Abilities graduates have all found placements in the community. Paul A. has been working at the Brantford Museum. Alyssa F. has been working on a plan to create a business providing healthy home cooked meals. David C. has been volunteering at Amani Acres and is looking at building a business with Andrea providing light garden care

and maintenance. Eddie V. and

Kristian B. have an interest in music and will both be doing a placement with Pinks Productions which provides music event organization. And Dennis S. has a volunteer position at John Noble Home playing games and socializing with the residents. Andrew N., with the help of Ashley, is continuing work on his book and getting feedback from his editor. Andrew is also participating in the Business Planning and Strategic Planning Workshops to help with his overall business plan to sell his book and begin his tour as an inspirational public speaker.

Work-Abilities has been very fortunate to have benefited from the assistance of two local college students completing placements. Their contribution through this partnership has been invaluable and they will be missed. Good luck to Georgia Tooke from Mohawk College and Cori McLean from Fanshawe in completing their Social Service Worker programs and in their careers!

One of the most important parts of the Work-Abilities program is the use of our discovery process. This specialized training includes one of three different types of facilitation exercises. GIFTS is the use of a group setting to record the skills, qualities and gifts that each person individually brings to the world of those around them and then seeks to creatively find ways that allow the person to put them to good use for themselves and others in the community. PATHS and MAPS are both graphic facilitations that help a participant envision where they want to go in life by solidifying what they want to accomplish and the steps to get there with the support of the people around them.

Since 1980, the Brantwood Seating Clinic has designed and manufactured custom seating and positioning products to optimize safety, comfort, independence and support of people who require specialized seating products or adaptive equipment.

The Seating Department includes a team of highly qualified technicians augmented by an Occupational Therapist and Kinesiologist. Customers access our specialized seating clinic from across the province to assist in solving complex seating challenges.

This service, which includes assessment, recommendations, design, fabrication and installation of custom seating and mobility products, is available to any individual or facility that requires specialized seating or adaptive equipment. We are authorized to assess and prescribe mobility devices under the Assistive Device Program of the Ontario Ministry of Health.

## **HubScrub - Now Open for Business**

Earlier this year, Brantwood purchased a HubScrub, which is a medical equipment washer that cleans and disinfects wheelchairs as well as bath and shower chairs and walkers. This automated cleaning and disinfects wheelchairs, shower chairs and walkers. The HubScrub will clean and sanitize an entire chair in minutes, a process that can take several hours by hand.

Our automated wheelchair cleaning service is now available for anyone in the community to purchase. To book your appointment call 519-753-2658 ext. 100.

Brantwood has also been using the HubScrub as a training opportunity for people in the Work-Abilities program. Seating Technician Drew has been providing training to several people over the past few months. The eventual goal is to have a person supported by Brantwood manage the HubScrub on an ongoing basis.

The compliance audit ensures that agencies providing support to people with developmental disabilities are adhering to ministry standards.
